<u>Absentee guidelines (substitute policy)</u> – Scott Herber read Dr. Miedema's suggestions to the AAC. Laura Earle motioned to approve the revised Substitute Policy that include Dr. Miedema's suggestions. John Armstrong seconded. The motion passed.

Bill Fletcher said he is uncomfortable with the policy in how it addresses programs with only one faculty member. Scott Herber said he will address this with the substitute policy.

DISCUSSION

Searchable minutes: There are no updates to this; the IT project is still in progress.

<u>Retention Task Force recommendation</u>: Karen MacArthur showed the proposed table of contents from the Task Force and asked for AAC support of them. Katina Gothard motioned that the AAC supports the proposed contents and actions of the Task Force. Julie Derrick seconded. The motion passed.

<u>Facilities committee update</u>: Dr. Miedema has said that if faculty have concerns about facilities and their effect upon academics to please let her know so she can be of assistance. The AAC members want to continue with the formation of the committee. Scott Herber will compile the faculty comments regarding facilities issues and forward them to Dr. Miedema.

<u>Vice chair election</u>: Andrew Lieb was nominated to be the vice chair until the end of the spring 2016 semester. He agreed to accept the nomination.

DISCUSSION

<u>Underage travel</u>: The highest concern of underage student travel regards overnight or out-of-district travel. Is this a potential liability area for the college? Mixing ages is problematic with student groups. Many faculty don't want to be responsible for underage students on a trip. Katina Gothard motioned that the AAC recommends that ungraded underage student travel policies are administrative decisions but the AAC strongly encourages 18 years old and over be the rule. Laura Earle seconded. The motion passed.

<u>Off-agenda item: upcoming council election</u>: Scott Herber asked all members to be prepared for the election of a new Vice Chair and Secretary later in the semester.

Off-agenda item: Assessment Committee concerns: Katina Gothard expressed her concern that the current direction of the Assessment Committee will not address the need for program level assessment in time for the SACS review. There are four factors that are problematic for the committee: 1) There are co-chairs directing the committee instead of one person, 2) the AAC statement made in March 2015 that stopped committee activity, 3) having revolving committee members causes time delays as they learn how the assessment process works, and 4) the varying level of support among Assessment Committee members.

Katina Gothard said she believes Assessment Committee should be a specialized committee that doesn't have the majority of members revolving. Should there be qualifications to joining the committee?

Scott Herber said he will contact Jayne Gorham and Mark Quathamer to ask the status of the program level assessment.

Off-agenda item: textbook selection: Katina Gothard said many textbooks are chosen based upon face-to-face sections while some professors prefer to use online materials. Is there or can there be a split in disciplines among print versus online books? Laura Earle said disciplines can ask for an exception with justification if they choose to do this.
