OLD BUSINESS: BASIC COMPUTER SKILLS

DISCUSSION	<p>Chuck reviewed the history of this issue with the Academic Affairs Council (AAC) and asked them if this is still an issue for the college?</p> <p>Most definitely, yes! The AAC sent the issue back to ETAS for suggested solutions. One suggestion from the AAC was to package a list of help resources for faculty to give students struggling with basic computer skills.</p> <p>Other possible solutions discussed by the committee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Require students to "test out" before they graduate or before they are allowed to enroll in for-credit courses. • Have students take a required course at the beginning of their studies at EFSC, ex. LIS1023, CGS 1000, etc. • Insert training and assessment in Angel similar to the mandatory orientation • Create a PowerPoint training module, similar to the mandatory <i>Identifying and Reporting Child Abuse</i> training required of all employees. Skills demonstrations could be built into the training where one has to pass before proceeding through the module. • Incorporate computer skills videos into an orientation. The University of Phoenix and Webster University do something similar. <p>There are problems with some of the suggested solutions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • available credit hours are limited so adding a course may not be possible • financial aid / affordability issues <p>It's a good time to add basic computer skills with the upcoming LMS change.</p> <p>We could ask the SGA what students want for mastering basic computer skills.</p>

NEW BUSINESS: PUBLISHER WEBSITES

DISCUSSION	<p>Chuck also reviewed this issue with the AAC. The AAC would like the ETAS to come up with possible solutions.</p> <p>There are 42 courses at EFSC that use a publisher website or a textbook companion website. Either an access code is purchased by the student or one comes with the course textbook.</p> <p>Many sites have similar functionality to an LMS. Often the companion site contains exercises or assignments which are automatically graded by the site. The grades are stored on the publisher's site and have to be manually input into the Angel grade book.</p> <p>There are several concerns:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FERPA compliance • 508 compliance • Hard to bring in data from publisher's website into Angel/LMS • IT issues: browser compatibility, browser settings and additional plug-ins required, often mid-term • Technical Support issues, i.e. who does the student contact for help with the site? <p>Currently there is no standard textbook adoption process or form so there is no process for reviewing publisher's web sites either.</p> <p>When reviewing course materials faculty need to determine the technical requirements of these companion sites and make sure they are FERPA and 508 compliant.</p>
