### OLD BUSINESS: STUDENT BASIC COMPUTER SKILLS

<b>DISCUSSION</b>	<p>Stephen summarized the issue of students lacking necessary basic computer skills. Past solutions considered include requiring students to take a class or requiring students to take a test demonstrating their skills. Neither solution has been possible. Students can't be required to take a class because of existing curriculum constraints. A computer skills test is expensive and not all tests actually have students demonstrate the skill. There is also the issue of remediation. What to do with students that don't demonstrate basic computer skills?</p> <p>No subcommittee action has been taken yet.</p>
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	<p>Chuck suggested Stephen's subcommittee look at what skills are needed by students? Have needs changed over time? Maybe survey faculty to find out what issues they see in their classes?</p> <p>Sandi suggested rather than survey all faculty, survey a sampling of faculty across all disciplines that use Angel heavily.</p> <p>Once Stephen's subcommittee has a recommendation it will be reviewed by the entire ETAS and then Chuck will present to the AAC.</p>

OLD BUSINESS: THIRD PARTY WEB SITES

<b>DISCUSSION</b>	<p>Chuck presented a draft of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Web Sites Selection Guidelines. Currently there are 40 courses that use a 3<sup>rd</sup> party web site. Third party web sites are a concern because of FERPA, OSD and IT requirements and impacts.</p> <p>The guidelines will be used by faculty to work with the web site vendor to determine compliance. Documentation of compliance gathered by the faculty and vendor will be presented to ETAS for final review. The intention is not to make web site evaluation difficult.</p>	
<b>CONCLUSIONS</b>	<p>Committee reviewed and discussed the guidelines in depth. Several suggestions were made. Chuck will revise the document and share with the committee.</p>

NEW BUSINESS: WEB CONFERENCING TOOL RENEWALS

<b>DISCUSSION</b>	<p>There are two web conferencing tools being used at EFSC, Collaborate and Wimba. Both are up for renewal in August. Renewal costs are not yet available.</p> <p>Since Canvas has a web conferencing tool, is there a need to renew Collaborate or Wimba? However, Canvas won't be available to all users until January 2015 so there would be a gap in web conferencing capabilities.</p>	
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	<p>A possible solution would be to purchase individual licenses on a case-by-case basis for those faculty that need Collaborate or Wimba. How many licenses would be needed? Who negotiates the contracts for Collaborate or Wimba?</p> <p>Academic Technology needs to know what training to provide to faculty.</p>
