Course Description

Administrative investigations present unique challenges for law enforcement agencies and the investigators assigned to conduct them. A key distinction that impacts the manner and method of how administrative investigations are both federal case laws and state statutes on law enforcement employee investigations. In most cases, there are also terms of labor agreements and agency policies dictating how these investigations are handled.

These create mandates on the agency, provide employee rights, and afford protections that are very different from criminal investigations. This course will provide the participant with specific case law, statutory protections, and discuss other rules combined with strategies and procedures to properly conduct a defensible internal administrative case.

One possible result of an improperly conducted IA is CJSTC decertification of the investigator for not following these requirements.
