Dear Early Admission Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in the Early Admission Program. Submitting the following documents by the application deadline of **Thursday, May 7, 2026**, confirms that you will be a high school senior in the 2026-2027 school year and you plan to graduate in May 2027:

1. Early Admission Application and Eligibility Evaluation: Completed and signed by you and your high school counselor. Be sure to include your EFSC student identification number (B#).
2. Early Admission Student/Parent Agreement: Signed by you and your parent/legal guardian.

Early acceptance allows you to register for classes when registration begins, so it is beneficial to submit your application BEFORE the **May 7** deadline. **Please check your Student Titan Email for notification about your application status. The College will not send notices to your personal email address.**

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

Email your application **from your Student Titan Email** with all documents saved as **PDF** attachments to binningerd@easternflorida.edu **Applications submitted in paper/hard copy form or sent from a personal email address will not be accepted. Parents/high school counselors may not submit the application for you.**

PENDING STATUS

If you do not have the required 3.0 high school GPA or college-ready test scores in Reading, Writing, and Math by **May 7**, your application will be Pending. When you meet eligibility, contact me and I will update your status to Accepted. **Note: All eligibility requirements must be met by July 23, 2026.**

2026 EFSC FALL REGISTRATION

After you receive your acceptance letter, you may register for 4 or 5 fall classes when the registration window opens. A 3.5 cumulative unweighted GPA and permission from your high school are required to register for six courses.

NEW TO DUAL ENROLLMENT? If you have never dual enrolled before, you must complete the EFSC admissions process **before** you turn in your Early Admission Application. Review the EFSC Dual Enrollment webpage for important dates and deadlines.

1. Complete and submit the EFSC Online Application and receive your acceptance letter.
2. Provide college-ready placement test scores in Reading, Writing, and Math. **Students are responsible for ensuring their SAT/ACT/PSAT/CLT scores are on file at EFSC!**
3. Complete the mandatory Dual Enrollment Online Orientation and Initial Advising Appointment.

**If utilizing an EFSC summer course (Session A, C, or D) to meet the high school GPA requirement, the eligibility deadline is August 10, 2026.*

2026-2027 EARLY ADMISSION STUDENT/PARENT AGREEMENT

Through Early Admission, qualified seniors attend Eastern Florida State College full-time for either the entire year or the spring term only. Participants take all their courses at EFSC while remaining eligible to participate in high school extracurricular and graduation activities. Upon completion of the spring term, participants are no longer eligible for Dual Enrollment since Early Admission counts as the student's final year of high school. It is important that both you and your parent/legal guardian are aware of pertinent high school and college policies and procedures.

I understand that:

1. While taking courses towards my selected degree program, I must also meet any remaining high school graduation requirements through equivalent college courses. Textbooks, support materials, lectures, and assignments in EFSC courses have been developed for adult students (typically age 18 and older) and will not be modified to accommodate younger students.
2. I must register for at least twelve (12) credit hours/four (4) courses in the fall term and twelve (12) credit hours/four (4) courses in the spring term. A co-requisite lab course, i.e. CHML 1045, will not count as the fourth course. If my EFSC courseload drops below four courses, I will be considered part-time Dual Enrollment, and my high school will require that I enroll in additional high school courses.
3. Withdrawal from an EFSC course(s) or a grade of "F" may jeopardize my high school graduation and continuation in the program. Poor grades and withdrawals may also affect scholarships and university admission; grades received in college courses taken through Dual Enrollment become a part of my permanent college and high school transcript.
4. Inappropriate and disruptive behavior may result in administrative withdrawal from the Early Admission Program and EFSC courses, and I may be ineligible for Dual Enrollment in the subsequent term. Academic dishonesty may result in a grade of "F" in the course.
5. If I am expelled from my high school and/or assigned to an alternative setting because of conduct violations at a high school activity, I will lose Dual Enrollment eligibility and may be administratively withdrawn from EFSC courses.
6. It is my responsibility to maintain regular communication with my high school, so I am aware of important dates relating to any required testing, scholarship opportunities, and graduation activities. This includes submission of name for diploma list, ordering of cap and gown, graduation announcements, and any other event or activity of significance to graduating seniors.
7. College credits I earn at EFSC transfer to any of Florida's public postsecondary institutions if the receiving institution offers an equivalent course with the same prefix and course number.
8. Since EFSC does not guarantee the transfer of credits to postsecondary institutions outside of Florida or to private institutions, I should consult with the Admissions Office at my intended college or university for specific information.
9. I will adhere to college policies regarding attendance, grades, confidentiality, deadlines, and student conduct; it is my responsibility to ensure that I am aware of, and understand, all instructor requirements.
10. EFSC, in conjunction with the Barnes & Noble Titan First Day Ready Program, provides required instructional materials to public, private, and home school students. It is my responsibility to purchase required one-time use instructional materials, such as workbooks or lab manuals, that cannot be reused by another student. I must return loaned materials by the return deadline.
11. My acceptance into Early Admission is provisional pending final eligibility verification.
