

## ArticulationAgreement-Postsecondary Vocational (PSAV) to AS Degree Florida Law Enforcement Academy PSAV to AS Criminal Justice Academy Memorandum of Understanding

In accordance with the FDOE Postsecondary Adult Vocational (PSAV) to AS Degree Articulation below, Eastern Florida State College will award credit as follows:

## Procedure for Obtaining Credit

Student must meet the following criteria:

- > Meet all EFSC admissions requirements pertaining to entering the program listed above.
- > Be an active student currently enrolled in the program listed above and in good academic standing. Student's major must reflect the program listed in the agreement.
- > Complete three credit hours of a technical course in an above listed program through traditional instruction at EFSC with a grade of "C" or better.
- Certification must NOT BE EXPIRED at the time the credit will be awarded, and the certification must have been issued within three years prior to enrollment in the program.
- Must complete all major courses in the Criminal Justice AS program.
- Submit transcripts to include proof of completion of the Law Enforcement Academy Basic Recruit PSAV program from a Florida Department of Education approved Technical Center and/or Community College to the Office of the Registrar.
- Must provide proof from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) of passage of the Officer Competency Exam (State Licensure Exam for Law Enforcement Officers) to the Office of the Registrar.
- > Submit the "Petition for Articulated Credit" form and include a copy of the above listed certification to: EFSC, Office of the Registrar, 1519 Clearlake Road, Cocoa, FL 32922.
- Credit will be awarded with grade of "S" which will not affect the student's grade point average. Duplicate credit will not be awarded. Degrees or certificates are not conferred unless a minimum of 25% of the degree or certificate program requirements are completed through traditional coursework taken at EFSC.
- > Questions regarding this agreement should be addressed to the Director of Career & Technical Programs or the Office of the Registrar.

Admission Requirements: Students entering the Associate in Applied Science or Associate in Science Degree Program in Criminal Justice Technology/ Criminal Justice Technology (60) must have a standard high school diploma or its equivalent, or a CPT Eligible Certificate of Completion.

Validation Mechanisms: Passage of State Licensure Exam for Law Enforcement Officer

School district technical center and state college faculty committee met and agreed to propose that the <u>770</u> clock hour program in <u>Law Enforcement (Basic Recruit Program)</u> shall articulate <u>fifteen (15)</u> college credit hours to the AAS or AS Degree in <u>Criminal Justice Technology/ Criminal Justice Technology (60)</u>. This agreement does not preclude but encourages the awarding of additional credits by any college through local agreements.

State College: AAS/AS in Criminal Justice - Total of 60 credits

AAS/AS in Criminal Justice Technology - Total of 60 credits

Will award course credits or a block of credit toward the AAS or AS program for 15 (fifteen) hours of credit.
