

Articulation Agreement – Prior Training or Licensure or Certification
Memorandum of Understanding

**Florida Paramedic Licensure (current) and Training to
Emergency Medical Services AS Degree**

Eastern Florida State College (EFSC) will award postsecondary credit to eligible students who have met the criteria as stated below. *The student will not be charged tuition or fees for the postsecondary credit awarded.*

EFFECTIVE TERM DATE: Fall 2013

CRITERIA TO RECEIVE CREDIT

- Hold a current Florida Paramedic License issued by the Florida Department of Health (FDOH) and all Paramedic training courses must have occurred at a Florida Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) accredited institution
- Student must be currently enrolled in the Emergency Medical Services AS degree program (AS/EMAS) at Eastern Florida State College:
AS Degree Program Title: Emergency Medical Services
AS Degree CIP: 1351090402
- Submit copy of the official license as well as all transcripts for paramedic training to: EFSC, Office of the Registrar
- Complete 25% of the EFSC AS/EMAS credits in residency prior to petitioning for credit
- Submit “Petition for Articulated Credit” form to the Program Coordinator/Manager or to the Dean of the Public Safety Institute

Once the above criteria are met the student will be considered to have satisfied the Emergency Medical Technician and the Paramedic course work credits of the Emergency Medical Services AS degree program and is eligible to petition to receive credits in the major, not to exceed 53 college credit hours.


Credit will be awarded with grade of “S” which will not affect the student’s grade point average. Duplicate credit will not be awarded.

Questions regarding this agreement should be addressed to the Program Manager, the Dean of the Public Safety Institute, the Office of the Vice President of Academic Affairs or the Registrar.


This local implementation of this widely recognized licensure and training to AS degree programs shall be effective upon the signature of the Eastern Florida State College president or his designee.
