Procedure for Obtaining Credit

Student must meet the following criteria:

- Meet all EFSC admissions requirements pertaining to entering the program(s) listed above.
- Be an active student currently enrolled in one of the programs listed above and in good academic standing. Student's major must reflect one of the programs listed in the agreement.
- Complete three credit hours of a technical course in an above listed program through traditional instruction at EFSC with a grade of "C" or better.
- Industry certification must NOT BE EXPIRED at the time the credit will be awarded, and the certification must have been issued within three years prior to enrollment in the program.
- Submit the "Petition for Articulated Credit" form and include a copy of the above listed industry certification to: EFSC, Office of the Registrar, 1519 Clearlake Road, Cocoa, FL 32922.
- Credit will be awarded with grade of "S" which will not affect the student's grade point average. Duplicate credit will not be awarded. Degrees or certificates are not conferred unless a minimum of 25% of the degree or certificate program requirements are completed through traditional coursework taken at EFSC.
- Questions regarding this agreement should be addressed to the Director of Career & Technical Programs or the Office of the Registrar.
