

## Eastern Florida State College - Hybrid Course Requirements

Hybrids are currently a 50/50 split of time available in face-to-face and online.

The 50/50 is a faculty requirement. This is not an attendance percentage/requirement for students.

There must be a specific time and space with a faculty member in the classroom/space.

Faculty have more flexibility to meet the 50/50 requirement. Some may continue to require students to be in class 50% and online 50%. Other may specify specific class dates of attendance, with the remaining work online. Others may have a fully online experience for the students but with faculty availability in the assigned class/space during the class time set in Banner.

### ***Instructor Definition:***

Instructors must be available to the students in the classroom/space a minimum of 50% of the contact hours at the course's scheduled day and time.

### ***Student Definition for Marketing and College Publications:***

You may have time in class as well as independent work online. Individual instructors will have different approaches to hybrid courses. Refer to the syllabus or contact your instructor directly.

### ***Banner Note:***

This hybrid course requires online coursework and may require face-to-face coursework. See the instructor.

- Recommended Definition of Hybrid Class for Students: "The course requires both online and face-to-face coursework."
- Recommended Definition of Hybrid Class for Instructors and Administrators: "Instructors must be available a minimum of 50% of the contact hours in the assigned classroom for the course at the course's scheduled day and time."
- Specific career programs may have more program-specific student attendance requirements noted in Banner.
- The committee will provide a one-page informational sheet for advisors and a one-page informational sheet for distribution to students.
- The student definition should be linked to the registration screen when a student enrolls in a hybrid course.
- We will offer faculty-led workshops to educate faculty on teaching hybrid courses.
